Withdrawal Management

Withdrawal Management Services (WMS) is a non-medical, social detox program that provides a safe environment for men and women experiencing the initial stages of withdrawal from alcohol or other substance abuse. All clients will be assisted in developing a personal care plan; will be provided with information about addictions and recovery; and will be supported in making positive lifestyle choices.

Referrals

Referrals may come from the client themselves or from any front-line agency, doctor, hospital/nursing station personnel, family or friend.

Admission Criteria

The main criteria for admission as an out-patient or in-patient to WMS is a desire on the part of the program participant to begin the process of change.

The person who wants to come to WMS will need to sign a “Client Agreement Form” which states that she or he will agree not to use alcohol or non-prescription drugs while taking part in the WMS program. If he/she “uses” during this time they may no longer qualify for participation in the withdrawal management program.
